First Time in more than 50 Years....

For the first time in more than 50 years (last time was 1966), Camp Buffalo will be the location of a section conclave, as Takachsin Lodge is host lodge this year. A Conclave is the gathering of lodges in the state of Indiana, and is like a mini-NOAC. It will be held at Camp Buffalo April 7th thru the 9th.

Our lodge as host lodge has many responsibilities. We need about 100 of our lodge members to come out and be a part of this great event. Our lodge will have a special patch for this event. Ceremonialists NEEDED

In order to induct and advance members, we need ceremonies. There are 3 sets of ceremony teams needed for the Spring OA weekend, that is Pre-Ordeal, Ordeal and Brotherhood. We need your help. However each ceremony needs an advisor and so if you are 21 or older and would like to be the advisor contact Eric. Contact him now to get the scripts as we want all ceremonies to be memorized and so you can get started now on such.

NOAC 18 is just around the corner...



The National OA Conference will be held in July 30-August 4, 2018 at Indiana University, and registration should begin in August 2017 and only those in our lodge whose dues are paid can register. There will be registration limits placed on the lodges so once this information is given to our lodge, we will notify you. Those 22 from our lodge who went to NOAC 2015 at MSU had a blast and learned a lot. NOAC 2018 has a maximum quota of 6,000 youth/adults and 2,000 staff for a total of 8,000 where there were 15,000+ at MSU in 2015. So there will be strict quotas. Our guess at this time is that we will be able to bring about 9 youth and 3 adults. Approximate cost will be around \$500.



Another Reason to pay your dues now!

If you are a brotherhood member who has been a brotherhood member for at least 2 years, you are eligible to be considered for Vigil Honor. Vigil Honor is the highest honor that a lodge can bestow on its members. Less than 2% of Arrowman ever become Vigil. The Vigil Honor Committee will meet at the Spring OA Weekend, and only those whose 2017 dues are paid are eligible to be considered. Also, the Vigil Honor induction will take place at the Fall OA Weekend.

Spring OA Weekend

You may have noticed that we no longer call it Ordeal weekend, for our Spring and Fall weekends are not just "ordeal" weekends, but a time for all members to come to camp and give in cheerful service, for we are the Brotherhood of Cheerful Service. The Spring OA weekend is May 12-14, 2017 at Cary Camp.

Patches, Patches, Patches...

In addition to the event patches that we give out at the Spring and Fall OA Weekends and at the Fall Fun Fellowship, there will be several additional patches that the lodge will have for sale this year and next. These include the 2018 NOAC flap(s), the 45th Anniversary lodge flap along with a special lodge contingent patch for conclave.

Got an Idea for our 45th Anniv. Flap?

Our lodge over the years have issued several anniversary flaps starting with the 10th anniversary flap. In 2018, we will have completed 45 years as Takachsin Lodge and the LEC (lodge executive committee) is planning for a 45th Anniversary flap. Events are Pre-register Only

Our LEC (lodge executive committee) took action last year that all events going forward would be pre-register only. We allow registration up to like 5 days before the event. There are many reasons for this including planning logistics and extra costs for meals. It typically cost a member attending an event a couple extra bucks because of having to purchase food for an unknown number of participants. National Dues also are going up \$2 a member, which the lodge continues to tighten its belt on the expenses. (this is one reason why we sell patches, to help offset these costs).

So if you are planning on attending the conclave, Spring and/or Fall OA weekend, Fall Fun Fellowship/Winter Banquet, etc. you must preregister and pay at campmaster or at the council office. Visit our Website takachsin.org and click on event registration for more info.

Gandhi made peaceful protest and peaceful civil disobedience a valuable process of peaceful change. Susan B. Anthony rose to the challenge as a famous leader in the battle to obtain women's right to vote in the U.S. In 1908, an acclaimed English war hero, Robert Baden Powell, founded the Scouting movement in Great Britain. Seven years later at Treasure Island on the Delaware River, E. Urner Goodman launched an innovative program, the Order of the Arrow, which is based on peer recognition and service to others.
